Summer is here and I and your City Council wish you a fun, safe, and COVID free summer. We have planned several events this year to put on your calendars. Our first event is the Fourth of July parade that will start at 10:00 AM on Merrick Rd. led by our Indian Hills Police and the St. Matthews Fire Department. I want to thank Kelly Seiler for bringing back the parade and organizing this great event for our kids and adults.

On Saturday August 28th from 9:00 – 12:00 the City of Indian Hills will sponsor a shred day. CITY BUDGET & TAX RATE

At our June Council Meeting, the Council passed an annual budget for FYE 06/2022 as provided in Ordinance No. 1, Series 2021 and is posted on our website (www.indianhillsky.org)

At a later date, the Council will vote on a property tax rate for FYE 06/2022. Since several, if not all, properties in our City were reassessed by the Jefferson County PVA and some of the assessments may be lowered due to appeals by the taxpayers, the City was advised by a Kentucky League of Cities representative to delay passing a tax rate ordinance until the property assessments become final and are provided by the Jefferson County PVA. This may take until July or August.

ATTENTION TO:



Owners allowing their dogs run loose. City Ordinance (Code 6.04.020) reads in part:

6.04.020 Animals running at large.

"A. No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane, or alley, or upon unenclosed land, or permit it to go on any private yard, lot, or enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot, or enclosure.

6.04.010 Definitions. "'At large' means off the premises of the owner, and not under the control of the owner or his/her agent either by leash, cord, chain, or otherwise."

PLEASE abide by City Ordinance—Keep your dogs on a leash!

Owners not picking up their pet's excrement. City Ordinance (Code 6.04.070) reads in part:

6.04.070 Removal of animal excrement.

"No person shall allow an animal to be upon public property or the property of another, absent the consent of the owner or occupant of the property, without some device for the removal and containment of the animal's excrement; nor shall any person fail to remove any excrement deposited on public or private property within the city by any animal...."

PLEASE abide by City Ordinance—Pick up your pet's waste and dispose of it properly!

Residents with lawn care service. City Ordinance (Code 8.24.020) reads:

8.24.020 Scheduling.

"It shall be unlawful for a commercial grass cutter to mow lawns in the City of Indian Hills on any day before 8:00 A.M. or after 6:00 P.M. or during any hour on Sunday."

PLEASE abide by City Ordinance—No commercial lawn care on Sundays, not before 8:00 a.m. or later than 6:00 p.m. any other day!

Basically, any firework that flies or explodes is prohibited.

HOUSE WATCH PROGRAM

As COVID-19 travel restrictions ease across the country, we expect to see an increase in residents utilizing our House Watch Program. This service involves our patrol officers checking the exterior of your home several times each day – observing for anything amiss. We believe that our random presence deters burglary or theft attempts at the participating homes, and we encourage everyone to take advantage of this service. Indian Hills Canopy Tree Program - 2021



It may have been a long dark winter but there's lots of green on the horizon! The Indian Hills Tree Committee is back for the 5th continuous year, offering new options for our Canopy Tree packages.

What have we accomplished?

The committee's efforts resulted in the planting of about **100** trees! And this year we can add another **30** to the total!

Tell me again why we need trees? If you're new to the program or to the benefits of canopy trees, there are many environmental, economic and aesthetic benefits.

What can you do to make a difference in 2021?

Consider planting a canopy tree on your property (front or side). IH will continue to share the expense with the resident. The total cost is \$500. You agree to pay half the total cost of the tree & services provided (\$250.00) and the City pays the other half (\$250.00).

Attached is an application and instructions for the IH Tree Program. This year's tree choices are listed on the application.

New resident "*Welcome Trees*" - if you are new to Indian Hills (June 1, 2020 to June 1, 2021), you can enter your name for one of three (3) *FREE* trees to be given away with all costs paid by the Indian Hills Environmental Committee. The odds are quite good! And it's a great opportunity to meet the IH committee members and learn about the program!

Existing residents – the successful program remains the same with half the cost paid by the homeowner and the other half by the City of Indian Hills.

Entering your name in the drawing does not obligate you to take part in the program if your name is drawn. So go ahead and complete the form and submit online using the link or follow instructions to mail or email by the deadline

We are excited to have you participate. Please read the following instructions and feel free to ask any questions prior to completing and submitting the attached application below.

Costs are shared between the City and private property owners:

- This program is a shared expense between the resident and the City of Indian Hills. The total cost is to be about \$500. You agree to pay half the total cost of the tree & services provided (\$250.00) and the City pays the other half (\$250.00).
- We only have 30 trees to offer this year and they are available to any resident of the City of Indian Hills who owns a detached home and is a taxpayer.
- This program is limited to one tree per household. *Elected officials & Committee members are not eligible.*
- The tree must be planted in the front or side yard to optimize canopy shade tree benefits.
- Species for this program are limited to those designated by the arborist and include: Tulip Poplar, Willow Oak, White Oak and Red Maple.
