

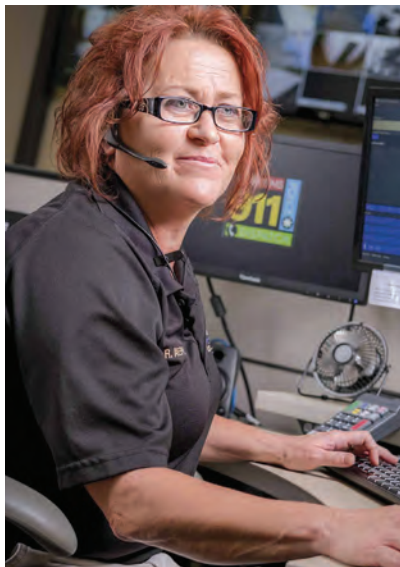

As DOCJT continues to expand the use of Blackboard as a learning management tool within its classes, it's important to note that in 2024, all training students should bring a computer with them for course work, even if the class is taught in person. Computers will be necessary for completing assignments and accessing training materials.

We are excited to roll out a new format for basic training courses! Beginning with class 548, all basic training classes will have an online component of 81.5 hours in advance of attendance here at DOCJT. Our staff has worked very hard to develop this course, and I am sure your recruits will love the new format.

I'd also like to encourage agency leaders whose employees are attending online training this year to provide ample time and space for the appropriate attention to these courses. Online Instruction - Asynchronous: Asynchronous learning allows you to learn on your own schedule, within a certain timeframe. You can access and complete lectures, readings, homework and other learning materials at any time during a given period. There may be sequenced assignments that must be completed at specified times.

Virtual Instruction - Synchronous: Synchronous learning means that although you will be learning from a distance, you will virtually attend a class session each day, at the same time as your instructor and classmates. The class is a firm, daily time commitment that cannot be rescheduled.

Blended Instruction: Includes both classroom instruction and Online - Asynchronous.

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ACADEMY OF POLICE SUPERVISION

120 Hours

APS is the first course in the Leadership Development for Sergeants or First-Line Supervisors. Students are expected to complete all reading and writing assignments and to actively participate in practical-based exercises designed to develop or enhance their supervisory abilities. Students can expect assignments that will require them to perform activities during hours outside the normal classroom times. The learning outcomes for this course will be for students to apply situational leadership and demonstrate an understanding of constitutional and administrative law, emotional and social intelligence, change, ethical decision-making, problem-solving, emotional survival, and public speaking in their role as a supervisor. Students must be capable of moderate physical activity; therefore, students on light or restricted duty are not eligible to attend. An agency Class A uniform (business suit and tie if not assigned to uniform duties) will be required to dress on certain course dates. Due to demand, Corporals and persons on promotional lists are not eligible to attend.

IMPORTANT: Agencies are responsible for completing KLEC process through LETRS to reflect the attending officer's current rank.

ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE

40 Hours

The Active Shooter Response course is meticulously designed to enhance participants' expertise and capabilities in effectively countering active, mass-murder threats. This course equips students with the requisite skills and knowledge to react swiftly and decisively when confronted with such critical situations, employing hands-on training methodologies.

This course elevates active-shooter preparedness to a new standard by integrating immersive and dynamic interactive drills, along with scenario-based exercises that closely replicate real-life scenarios. The curriculum of this course is comprehensive, delving into a range of tactical subjects, including single officer and dual officer building searches, as well as close quarters battle (CQB) techniques. Furthermore, the program places a significant emphasis on the roles and responsibilities of responding officers in such high-stress situations.

Fingerprints are often quite compelling circumstantial evidence in a criminal trial. Before this evidence can be introduced in court, it must first be located at a crime scene and collected. This course will provide patrol officers and investigators with the knowledge and skills they will need to perform this task. Topics will include chemical developing and the use of alternate light sources for the development of latent fingerprints.

BASIC BREATH TEST OPERATOR

24 Hours

The operator's ability to operate a fair and proper breath test and develop articulation skills for courtroom testimony is the goal of the training course. The course consists of 24 hours of concentrated instruction in the operation of the Intoxilyzer Breath Alcohol Testing Instruments. The information is disseminated through the use of both lecture and practical training devices. Per 500 KAR 8:010, the successful completion of this course is required to become a certified breath test operator in Kentucky.

Topics will include: Legal, Interviewing and Report Writing, Property Crimes and Crime Scene, Death Investigations, Overdose Deaths, Child Abuse, Interviewing related to Child Abuse, Sexual Assaults, Narcotics, Electronic Crimes, Search Warrants, and Technology / Investigative resources. Crime scene and evidence collection in relation to all topics taught. Officers will be given a case and will have to investigate the case to include the crime scene process. Officers will present the case on the final day to the instructors for a final grade.

BASIC NARCOTICS INVESTIGATIONS - RCTA

74 Hours

This course will cover the fundamental duties and responsibilities of a narcotics investigator. The skills learned in this course will disrupt the operations of national and transnational organized criminal networks (TOC), limit their access to funding, reduce assets, and raise their cost of operations.

This course will cover high liability and critical areas of law enforcement. It will include defensive driving, basic firearms, defensive tactics and vehicle stops. This course is intended as a refresher training course for previously trained and experienced officers.

NOTE: This course does require the intermediate/moderate physical capabilities associated with firearms training (e.g., positional shooting from kneeling to standing and standing to kneeling), emergency vehicle operations driving, and defensive tactics related to handcuffing and other techniques.

NOTE: This re-certification training is exclusively for peace officers who are employed or appointed by a law enforcement agency and must be certified to meet KLEC training requirements for active certification purposes mandated by KRS. This course is intended as refresher training and certification of skills for officers who have been academy trained in Kentucky and are returning to law enforcement after a break in service.

Performance tasks will include both defensive tactics and weapons qualification.

During this training course, a law enforcement recruit will be expected to complete physical and cognitive learning tasks, including practical applied assessments and testing, with scores that meet regulated standards. They will also be required to demonstrate the professional expectations of a Kentucky law enforcement officer. To be eligible for graduation, the law enforcement recruit must comply with all Kentucky Administrative Regulations and successfully complete all training areas. The training areas within this course include the required basic training topics: legal subjects, physical training, defensive tactics, patrol, vehicle operations, firearms, criminal investigations, DUI and field sobriety testing, breath testing, practical evaluations, and tests. For eligible law enforcement recruits, all meals, housing, and classroom materials are provided. Upon successful registration for this course, a detailed list is provided of all requirements that will be needed for training.

TACTICAL MEDICINE INSTRUCTOR TRAINER COURSE

25 Hours

This course will provide instructors with the necessary skills to teach basic tactical medicine principles that offer recruits and in-service personnel the needed skills to apply lifesaving interventions. This is a highly intense training program requiring a physical demand on the student and consists of lectures, labs, and skill practice. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to mitigate the loss of their life or the life of another while in a dynamic environment. The skills will address treating life-threatening injuries in an austere environment with limited equipment, lack of medically trained personnel, and prolonged time to evacuation.

Tactical Medicine is a systematic approach to dealing with casualties in a tactical environment. It is strongly influenced by the model used by the Department of Defense called Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC). As the name implies, TCCC incorporates tactical problem-solving into any situation in which casualties are incurred from an armed, hostile opponent. The TCCC system focuses on saving “preventable deaths” while achieving three primary goals: Treat the Casualty, Prevent Additional Casualties, and Continue the Mission.

Additionally, three contemporary models of leadership, Servant, Transactional, and Transformational will be described with identification of the style most used with its rewards and limitations.
