1. Police Report – May - Chief Spratt – Chief Spratt’s report included three criminal reports, one traffic collision, one arrest/criminal citation issued, multiple traffic citations issued and year-to-date stats.

(c) Public Works & Building – Graven

1. Public Works Director Report – Graven - As given by Mayor Hancock, Mr. Graven’s Report included updates on the following:

- 4th of July Parade.
- Honeysuckle clearing along Brownsboro Road.
- The construction on a home on Indian Hills Trail-Council would like the pile of dirt & the removal of the backyard fence addressed with the new contractor-Mayor Hancock will get with Mr. Graven.
- Shredding Event scheduled from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm on Saturday August 28th at Sagamore Park. Mayor Hancock informed Council there is now a fee of \$100 the first hour and \$60 for each additional hour and asked for Council approval. Councillor Matton moved to approve the expenditure for the Shredding Event; Councillor Dunbar seconded; motion passed unanimously.
- Mayor Hancock informed Council of the collapse of a sewer line on Old Brownsboro Road and MSD will have the road closed for a few days.
