The Department of Criminal Justice Training is proud to offer the 2025 training schedule, which includes more than 135 course options and 855 classes to meet your professional development needs. Our staff has incorporated your input to increase our online offerings while maintaining a variety of in-person courses distributed among 27 locations across the Commonwealth.

The most significant change in the 2025 training catalog is the addition of Law Enforcement Basic Training in Western Kentucky. In collaboration with the city of Madisonville, DOCJT will begin training recruits in Spring 2025 at the Madisonville Police Department Regional Training Center and plans to break ground on a new DOCJT training facility nearby later in the year. This historic initiative will not only reduce travel time for recruits in the western part of the state but will also free up basic training seats at the Richmond campus.

Class registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, November 15, 2024, through the LETRS portal. You will have two weeks to review the schedule and find your classes before registration opens.

As DOCJT continues to expand the use of Blackboard as a learning management tool, it's essential that all training participants bring a computer for coursework, even if the class is taught in person. Computers will be necessary for completing assignments, accessing training materials, and completing assessments.

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APS is the first course in the Leadership Development for Sergeants or First-Line Supervisors. Students are expected to complete all reading and writing assignments and to actively participate in practical-based exercises designed to develop or enhance their supervisory abilities. Students can expect assignments that will require them to perform activities during hours outside the normal classroom times. The learning outcomes for this course will be for students to apply situational leadership and demonstrate an understanding of constitutional and administrative law, emotional and social intelligence, change, ethical decision-making, problem-solving, emotional survival, and public speaking in their role as a supervisor. Students must be capable of moderate physical activity; therefore, students on light or restricted duty are not eligible to attend. An agency Class A uniform (business suit and tie if not assigned to uniform duties) will be required to dress on certain course dates. Due to demand, Corporals and persons on promotional lists are not eligible to attend.

All requests for registration will go on a waitlist and chosen by the instructor.

The Active Shooter Response course is meticulously designed to enhance participants' expertise and capabilities in effectively countering active, mass-murder threats. This course equips students with the requisite skills and knowledge to react swiftly and decisively when confronted with such critical situations, employing hands-on training methodologies.

This course elevates active-shooter preparedness to a new standard by integrating immersive and dynamic interactive drills, along with scenario-based exercises that closely replicate real-life scenarios. The curriculum of this course is comprehensive, delving into a range of tactical subjects, including single officer and dual officer building searches, as well as close quarters battle (CQB) techniques. Furthermore, the program places a significant emphasis on the roles and responsibilities of responding officers in such high-stress situations.

BASIC NARCOTICS INVESTIGATORS SCHOOL - DEA

This course covers a variety of narcotics enforcement issues, from case initiation to court presentation. Key topics include: state and federal narcotics laws, investigating conspiracy cases, criminal interdiction, and analyzing intelligence and surveillance. Also discussed are the history and pattern of drug trafficking, and the collection, preservation, and submission of drug evidence. In addition to classroom lectures, interactive practical exercises will be used to assist in the instruction of undercover drug operations, informant debriefing, and raid planning and execution. Instruction will be provided by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration.

KRS: 15.380 to 15.404 establishes the position of certified Court Security Officer and mandates 80 hours of job-specific basic training for new hires. This training meets those requirements by providing the student with classroom instruction on the role of the court security officer: duties and responsibilities, legal topics to include arrest, search and seizure and use of force issues, interpersonal communication, courtroom protocol, and security. TACTICAL MEDICINE INSTRUCTOR TRAINER COURSE

This course will provide instructors with the necessary skills to teach basic tactical medicine principles that offer recruits and in-service personnel the needed skills to apply lifesaving interventions. This is a highly intense training program requiring a physical demand on the student and consists of lectures, labs, and skill practice. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to mitigate the loss of their life or the life of another while in a dynamic environment. The skills will address treating life-threatening injuries in an austere environment with limited equipment, lack of medically trained personnel, and prolonged time to evacuation.

Tactical Medicine is a systematic approach to dealing with casualties in a tactical environment. It is strongly influenced by the model used by the Department of Defense called Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC). As the name implies, TCCC incorporates tactical problem-solving into any situation in which casualties are incurred from an armed, hostile opponent. The TCCC system focuses on saving "preventable deaths" while achieving three primary goals: Treat the Casualty, Prevent Additional Casualties, and Continue the Mission.

How To Save A Life, Yours! The kind of stress that Public Safety Dispatchers experience is not the garden-variety stress the average person experiences. Fear, helplessness, or horror are just some of the potential emotional responses that come with the job and can have lasting effects. Cumulative stress can affect work performance, work attendance, personal relationships, and social relationships, in addition to presenting a multitude of physical manifestations. Dispatchers for the most part live very unhealthy lives, we eat unhealthy foods, drink unhealthy drinks, sit too long and put ourselves at risk. We will learn to recognize physical symptoms of vicarious trauma and dispatcher self-care. Self-care is an important part of stress management and should be a routine part of healthy living for every 9-1-1 Dispatcher. This class will share some life/health-changing education and techniques to assist in the reduction of stress, improve working relationships and improve morale. We will talk about the resources in place to help dispatchers cope with PTSD, such as peer support and PCIS (Post Critical Incident Seminar).
